Who is SURJ PDX?

SURJ PDX (Showing Up for Racial Justice-Portland, Oregon Chapter) is an all-volunteer group focused on educating, organizing, and mobilizing white people in the Portland Metropolitan Area to do racial justice work in partnership with BIPOC-led organizations in the fight for collective liberation.

What is this guide for?

This candidate comparison guide focuses specifically on issues of police accountability, funding, training, and roles, to help voters make decisions about who to support.

Why aren't all the candidates included?

Due to the unprecedented number of candidates and limited volunteer time and capacity, we narrowed our research efforts.

POLICE ACCOUNTABILITY

Systems of policing and incarceration are designed to cause harm, and no amount of accountability for individual police officers will make those systems good.

And, we want a mayor and city council who support the original policy recommendations produced by the Portland Police Accountability Commission (PAC). Current Portland City Council members made many changes that go against the clear original intent of Measure 26-217, which was supported by 82% of Portland voters. Some of those changes are designed to discourage and disqualify people from racialized and marginalized communities and those with a history of police interactions from being on the newly created Community Board for Police Accountability. For example, City Council changes add three police representatives on the nominating committee, require that board members go on a police ride-along, and disqualify potential board members based on vague and undefined "bias against police." It will be up to those elected to Portland's new City Council to implement this new system of police accountability moving forward. We need City Council members who are willing to fight for the voters' original intent. More info <u>here</u>, <u>here</u>, and <u>here</u>.

POLICE FUNDING

No amount of funding will make systems of policing and incarceration good.

So, we want a mayor and city council who will decrease funding to the Portland Police Bureau and shift/restore funding to beneficial public resources that will actually reduce harm. This includes housing and food security, free education and childcare programs, addiction support services, and a restored and expanded Portland Street Response. More info here.

POLICE TRAINING

No amount of training will make systems of policing and incarceration good.

And, we want a mayor and city council who believe that Portland Police officers should only be able to earn training credits from sources that are approved with community oversight. "Warrior Cop" and "Killology" should have no place in Portland Police training. More info here.

POLICE ROLE: HOUSELESSNESS

The criminal legal system makes the housing crisis worse.

So, we want a mayor and city council who do not support Portland Police officers arresting and/or fining people if they decline shelter. More info here.

POLICE ROLE: DRUGS

The criminal legal system has boosted mass incarceration through drug law enforcement.

So, we want a mayor and city council who do not support Portland Police officers arresting and/or fining people for possession of drugs for personal use. More info here.

PORTLAND STREET RESPONSE

We need to build, expand, improve, and maintain systems to support people in need of help that don't involve sending a person with a gun.

So, we want a mayor and city council who will fully fund and expand Portland Street Response to cover all of Portland, 24 hours per day, 7 days per week—and who will implement the recommendations from the Year Two Program Evaluation produced by the Homelessness Research & Action Collaborative.
